Health Education Lectures by Dr. Pennings to begin in January '09

As part of its ongoing commitment to improving the quality of healthcare for the Warwick community, St. Anthony Community Hospital will host a three part series of health education lectures by **Nicholas J. Pennings, DO**, a Board Certified Family Practice Physician.



The subjects of the upcoming "Trilogy of Health" series this January, March and May include weight loss, smoking and stress management. All lectures are free and open to the public.

On Saturday morning, January 24, Dr. Pennings will offer his first presentation on "Why Our Bodies Like to Get Fat," and "How to Lose Weight." The lecture will begin promptly at 11 a.m. in the Greenbriar Room at Mount Alverno Center. During his presentation,

Dr. Pennings will discuss the obesity epidemic in America and then address the question of why we gain weight, the health consequences of weight gain, the role of exercise and a healthy diet and what you can do to lose the most weight in the shortest time. He reports, for example, that overweight patients who followed the "Take Shape for Life," portion control and meal replacement program have lost as much as 60 pounds in as little as six months.
