

VISITOR RULES FOR SCHERVIER

- Visitation at Schervier Pavilion will take place on weekdays only (excluding holidays) at 10 am, 11 am and 1:30 pm as well as the 2nd and 4th Saturday of every month.
- Each resident can only have <u>two</u> visitors at a time. Visitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Animals should not be included in the visit unless the animals are service animals (with documented proof of the same). Those residents who are COVID-19 positive, residents with COVID-19 signs or symptoms and those residents who are currently on transmission-based precautions are <u>not</u> eligible for visitors (except under Compassionate Care guidelines)
- Outdoor visitation is preferred. When outdoor visits are permissible (temperatures consistently at 60 degrees or greater), visitation will take place in a specific area outside the building under the awning of the enclosed courtyard near the main entrance.
 - O During inclement weather, visitation will occur in Adult Day Health Care in the designated/demarcated areas.
- Visitors should arrive 15 minutes prior to their scheduled visitation time. (E.g. If you are visiting with your loved one at 10 am, you should arrive at 9:45 am to allow ample time for screening.)
- All visitors will be screened before the visit commences. Those who exhibit signs or symptoms and/or who do not pass the screening questions will be refused visitation. Screening questions will include, but not be limited to, recent exposure to COVID-19 through your work, your contacts and/or international travel; those who have been exposed will not be able to visit.
- Visits will last 30 minutes. (E.g. Visits beginning at 10 am will end at 10:30 am.) This is to allow staff
 ample time to bring our residents back to their rooms, to clean/disinfectant the seating, and to prepare
 for screening our next group of visitors.
- During visits, all visitors will be required to wear a face mask/face covering that covers both the nose and the mouth and will be asked to use hand sanitizer at the beginning of the visit and as appropriate during the visit. Social distancing of 6 feet must be maintained throughout the visit UNLESS the resident has been fully vaccinated. A staff member will supervise the visits. Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention will not be permitted to visit and will be asked to leave.
- PLEASE NOTE: Visitation will immediately be suspended if there is a new case of COVID-19 among residents or staff is identified.
