

Course Description

This conference will educate primary and specialty providers on the scope of the opioid addiction problem in adolescents and young adults both nationally and locally. Through lecture and case presentations, attendees will acquire a personal perspective on the impact of opioid addiction on patients and families, and improve their understanding of the range of medical treatment options for opioid addiction. In addition, faculty will teach skills regarding the screening, engagement and psychological treatment of individuals affected.

Learning Objectives

Conference participants will achieve the following objectives:

1. Participants will have a clear understanding of the increased prevalence and scope of the opioid addiction problem among young people in order to enhance their vigilance and skill in addressing this problem.
2. Participants will hear personal perspectives on the impact and challenges of opioid addiction from affected individuals and family members.
3. Participants will be educated about the use of current medical therapies for opioid addiction, including buprenorphine.
4. Participants will have increased skill in the psychological and developmental understanding of opioid addiction among adolescents and young adults as a means to facilitate screening and engagement of affected individuals in treatment.
